REFEREE SPOTLIGHT

Brian Tomblin Age: 53 Referee Start: 2023

"Started refereeing in NE Ohio when in high school once I realized that my current job as stock boy at a local department store was beyond awful. Was able to work my way up over a few seasons to head referee/assignor of a 2000+ player club league in East Cleveland. I played soccer in HS and then in college for Case Western Reserve. Graduated as a Mechanical Engineer and now VP of Engineering at Zeus which is a large local medical plastics company. I got away from the game for 20 years, didn't touch a ball or referee until my son Connor who plays for SCUFC got into soccer. While sitting at the fields waiting in the car for him to AR some random game I thought "Why am I sitting here?" I went through recertification in 2023 and here we are a long long time later. I thoroughly enjoy working games at any level and particularly remember those days in the Cleveland as a 20yr old working the international men's league in some pretty heated battles. If they couldn't fight the other team they would fight each other. LOL! That really happened a few times."

Did You Know ?!?!? (Law 14)

During a PK, the goalkeeper touches the crossbar causing it to move which distracts the kicker who is running at the ball. What is the correct decision if the shot misses the goal?

The penalty kick is retaken and the goalkeeper is warned if it is their first offense.



Did You Know ?!?!? (Law 12)

An attacker is fairly challenged from behind by a defender inside the penalty area. The challenge is not considered by the referee to be careless, reckless or using excessive force. What is the correct decision?

The referee allows play to continue because the defender did not commit a foul while challenging the opponent for the ball.



A defender (Team A) attempts to clear the ball out of the penalty area. The clearance is blocked by an opposing player (Team B), and the ball deflects off their foot to the Team B attacker in an offside position, who then scores a goal. What is the correct decision?

The referee disallows the goal and awards an indirect free kick to Team A. The attacker (Team B) is penalized for an offside offense because they interfered with play, having been in an offside position at the moment the ball was touched by another Team B player.
